

**RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF PASCAGOULA, MISSISSIPPI
AUTHORIZING SALE OF SURPLUS PROPERTY TO THE
JACKSON COUNTY, MS SHERIFF'S OFFICE**

WHEREAS, the City of Pascagoula (“the City”) owns a 19-foot Boston Whaler/Brunswick Center Console Boat (VIN-USWCG0026H607) and trailer (VIN-42XRBB19276F171872) and a Red/White Hardtop 1957 Chevrolet Belair Sedan (VIN-B57N229019) that were used for law enforcement and related purposes but are no longer in service; and

WHEREAS, the foregoing items of personal property are no longer of any value to the City, do not serve a useful function, and are not required for the continued effective operation of the City; and

WHEREAS, the foregoing items of personal property are surplus property of the City; and

WHEREAS, the Jackson County Sheriff’s Office desires to obtain the foregoing items of personal property; and

WHEREAS, the Jackson County Sheriff’s Office requests to purchase the foregoing items for the total amount of TEN AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$10.00), to be used for its department’s operations; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Mississippi Code Section 31-7-13(m)(vi), the City may sell said property to the Jackson County Sheriff’s Office at below fair market value, so long as the sale is in the best interest of the taxpayers of the State of Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, the sale of the foregoing items of personal property to the Jackson County Sheriff’s Office for the sum stated above is in the best interest of the taxpayers of the State of Mississippi.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: The City Council for the City of Pascagoula hereby adopts the foregoing recitals as its findings.

SECTION 2: The City’s 19-foot Boston Whaler/Brunswick Center Console Boat (VIN-USWCG0026H607) and trailer (VIN-42XRBB19276F171872) and a Red/White Hardtop 1957 Chevrolet Belair Sedan (VIN-B57N229019) are surplus property of the City of Pascagoula, and the intergovernmental sale of the aforementioned property below fair market value is in the best interest of the taxpayers of the State of Mississippi.

SECTION 3: The City hereby authorizes the sale of the foregoing items of personal property to the Jackson County Sheriff's Office for the amount of TENAND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$10.00), as such governmental sale is in the best interest of the taxpayers of the State of Mississippi.

SECTION 4: The City hereby authorizes the Inventory Control Director and the City Manager to execute documents necessary for the sale and authorizes the removal of the foregoing items of personal property from the City's inventory.
